Accessibility

- The nest is wheelchair accessible via elevator
- Wheelchair users sit in the front row
- All seats except the front row requires taking stairs, there is no railing for support
- There are no automatic buttons to open any of the doors
- Both washrooms are accessible, however, the women's washrooms are less easy to reach because of the baby change table which can be moved if you ask



Where is The Nest?


The Nest is inside this building called Festival House on Granville Island

At 1398 Cartwright Street

It is on the 3rd floor with the stairs or the elevator

Turn left at this sign to go there




The bike valet is on your left

- There is one Accessible parking in front of the door, there are more in front of Waterfront theatre next door





This is what the 50 Eastbound bus stop looks like.

When Walking from the 50 Bus Stop



Walk towards the Granville bridge above you. Cross Anderson Street at the lights.



After crossing Anderson Street, turn left and cross Lameys Mill Road and continue walking under the bridge along Anderson Street.

Skip to slide 22 for rest of directions.

When Walking from the 50 Bus Stop



This is what the 50 Westbound bus stop looks like.

Walk towards the bridge above you and cross Anderson Street at the lights.




Turn left as soon as you cross the street and continue to walk along Anderson Street underneath the bridge.

Skip to slide 22 for remainder of route.

When Walking from the 4, 7 and 84 Bus Stop.

Here is a map from the 4, 7 and 84 bus stops to the theatre.



This is what the 4, 7 and 84 Westbound bus stop looks like.

When Walking from the 4, 7 and 84 Bus Stop.



Turn right when you get off the bus and head along West 4th Ave towards Granville Bridge above you.



Cross Anderson Street at the lights and turn left.

Skip to slide 22 for remainder of route.

When Walking from the 4, 7 and 84 Bus Stop



This is what the 4, 7, and 84 Eastbound bus stop looks like.



Walk away from the Granville bridge towards Fir Street.

When Walking from the 4, 7 and 84 Bus Stop



Turn right at Fir Street and cross West 4th Avenue at the lights.



Once you cross the street, turn right and walk along 4th Avenue towards the Granville Bridge above you.

When Walking from the 4, 7 and 84 Bus Stop




Keep going along west 4th Ave until you cross Anderson Street under the bridge. Turn left down the path.

Skip to slide 22 for remainder of route.


Here is a map from the 10, 14 and 16 Bus stop to the theatre.



This is what the 10, 14 and 16 Southbound bus stop looks like.



Walk away from the Granville Street, down the path towards the park.



After a few feet turn right, into the underground walkway.



After a short while, you will come to a T intersection. Go right.



Just after you come out of the tunnel, and before the stairs, turn left.



Go up those stairs and turn right.



Right away, turn left down the first path in the park.

Skip to slide 20 for the remaining instructions.



This is what the 10, 14, and 16 Northbound bus stop looks like.

Walk back along Granville Street, away from the bridge.



After a few feet, turn left and go down the stairs towards the park.



Right away, turn left down the first path in the park.



Both routes continue together from here on.

Keep going down the path through the park until you reach West 4th Avenue.



Cross West 4th Avenue at the lights.



At the other side, immediately turn right and cross Anderson Street.

All routes combine here



As soon as you're across the street, turn left and go down the path.




Keep following the brick path, which follows the path of the bridge above you. This will take you all the way onto Granville Island.

Going to The Nest from Granville Island entrance






Walking to The Nest from Granville Island entrance



Turn right onto Cartwright Street after the yellow building. This is the Kids Market.



Keep walking down Cartwright St.

Walking to The Nest from Granville Island entrance



Keep walking straight along Cartwright Street. There isn't always a sidewalk so be careful.



Keep going straight!

Walking to The Nest from Granville Island entrance



Look for this parking sign as a landmark.




Festival House will be on your right (across the street).

The Nest is inside Festival House building



Look for this parking sign.
Festival House is across the street.



Enter through the glass doors under the awning.

There is no automatic door button.

Stroller parking



There is a stroller parking tent at the front door



Box Office

When you arrive go to the people at the lectern

They will scan your ticket or you can buy one with them



Going into the building



The Nest is on the third floor.

Taking the stairs

The stairs are anti-slip

The handrail has little bumps at the bottom

The handrail on the right goes the whole way up

The Nest is at the top floor

After 4 flights you will be at the top

Go through the door at the top





From the top of the stairs
you can see
the wooden doors
of the theatre

This is where you come in from the stairs

Go through the doors and turn left







When you leave the elevator the doors to the theatre are right in front of you






Stairs are through

This is what it looks like without people




Washrooms

It is right next to the women's washrooms
